


study contains a structural and synchronic The description of the Slovene dialect spoken in San Giorgio/V Bili, the westernmost village of the Val Resia/Rezijanska dolina. The following subjects are treated: phonetics/ phonolpgy, morphonemics, the morphology of the substantive, the adjective, the pronouns, the numerals, the article and the verb, and syntax. Dialect texts and a lexicon containing approximately 2800 lexical items (diminutives and prefixed verbs not counted), plus all attested forms, are also added. Although only the dialect of San Giorgio is described, in the introduction and in an appendix some attention is also paid to the accented vowel systems of the other Resian villages: Gniva/Njiva, Oseacco/Osojani and Stolvizza/Solbica.



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
