The William Green Human Relations Library is being created by the Jewish Labor Committee with the aid of a grant from the William Green Memorial Fund.

The Library will be open for service in early December, 1958. It will deal exclusively with the American trade union movement in relation to civil rights, human rights, and American minorities. The services of the library and its collection are extended to scholars, students and labour people throughout the country.

The collection includes material relevant to labour and human relations, emphasizing the following aspects:

- 1. The labour movement in relation to civil rights in the community.
- 2. Attitudes of workers and trade unionists on intergroup matters, and related psychological factors.
- 3. The labour movement's handling of internal minority problems.
- 4. The labour movement and civil rights questions in industry.
- 5. The role of minorities and all immigrant groups in building the labour movement.
- 6. The use of minority issues by employers in industrial disputes.
