Christopher Koch received his Ph.D. in Anthropology from the University of Toronto in 1986. Besides archaeology his interests include human skeletal biology and faunal studies, African traditional mortuary practices and burial archaeology, and urban origins on the East African coast. Dr. Koch has published in the African Archaeological Review, the Canadian Review of Physical Anthropology, Nyame Akuma, and in the edited collection, Problem Solving in Taphonomy.
