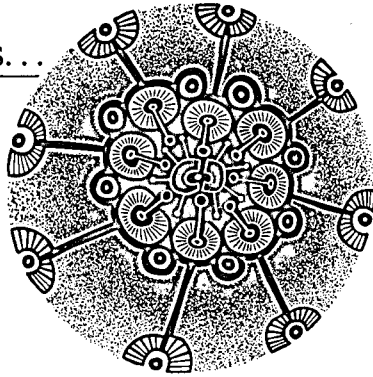

*Renascent Rationalism* represents a new and provocative departure from the often barren currents of twentieth-century philosophy. While the Leibniz-Russell theory of perception commands serious attention, it requires substantial adjustment in common-sense beliefs—all apparent worlds but one's own and the real world are beyond direct acquaintance, and the sole alternative is speculation about the radically unknowable. Theoretical scientists allow this, provided the speculation is grounded in empirical science. For *Renascent Rationalism* the result is a whole new philosophy of science and a tentative relational metaphysics. The latter includes the concept of 'hekerger', a generalization of the thermodynamic concept of free energy, leading to, among other things, a field-theory of mind—this, in turn, allows a new explanation of ego and other features of mind. The logical possibility of a mind in a state of maximum hekerger leads to a theory of supra-rationality, akin to those theories of Plato and Spinoza, in which seven distinct and significant meanings are found for the word 'God'.

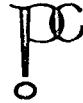
