
## LETTER TO THE EDITORS

## LIGATURE OF TONSILLAR VESSELS

## THE EDITORS,

The Journal of Laryngology and Otology.

SIRS,—Owing to a misprint (my own mistake most probably), the method of ligating tonsillar vessels which I demonstrated at the Scottish Society of Otology and Laryngology in 1925, and described in the *Journal* of March 1926, p. 186, is not clear.



The accompanying illustration shows the method I employ. The bleeding point is seized with a straight, fine-pointed pair of forceps. The bulbous fenestrated forceps is then placed over the point of the former and used only as a guide. The ligature readily slips over the bulbous end, is tied and then both forceps are removed. The surgeon requires only one pair of guide-forceps, no matter how many arteries require to be tied.—Yours faithfully, DONALD WATSON.
