Health, Medicine and Mortality in the Sixteenth Century

Edited by CHARLES WEBSTER

This, the first volume in a new series of monographs devoted to the history of medicine, comprises a collection of original studies concerned with a wide range of issues relating to health and disease in the sixteenth century. Both the state of health of the population and the agencies of health care are considered. This is the first volume to deal with such a wide spectrum of issues relating to health, disease and medicine within the community for any period of English history; it is also the first to adopt throughout quantitative bases for the problems under investigation. Although concentrating on England, it has more general appeal as a model investigation into medicine in western European society and will thus appeal to social historians as well as historians of medicine.

The Renaissance Notion of Woman

A study in the fortunes of scholasticism and medical science in European intellectual life

IAN MACLEAN

This study of the world of scholarship and scholarly texts in the Renaissance, the so-called *respublica literaria*, affords insights into the intellectual infrastructure and modes of thought of the period by its examination of contemporary attitudes towards women. It addresses the questions: What is the notion of woman in the Renaissance and how does it evolve? What is the relationship between the notion of woman and that of sex difference, and how is sex difference related in turn to other differences and to the concept of difference itself? Theology, medicine, ethics, politics and law are examined in succeeding chapters. Dr Maclean shows how the notion was influenced both by forces of conservatism and by forces which fostered change; forces which were to be found inside the confines of intellectual life as well as beyond them.

The final section offers a context for the understanding of European Renaissance feminism and sketches its connections with social and political evolution, humanistic scholarship, religious thought and finally problems of language and expression. This volume will be of interest to historians of science and to other historians interested in the Renaissance.
