

Report and acknowledgments for the year 2020

Here is the annual report for *Judgment and Decision Making*. we welcome suggestions and questions, including those concerning issues not mentioned here.

The year 2019 was eventful for the journal. Mandeep Dhami joined as a third editor. I am very happy about this. We have divided up the topics so that my workload is substantially reduced, giving me time for other projects. We have also recently concluded that we are getting too many submissions, especially (but not solely) of articles that are not in the field covered by the journal, so we have taken a few steps to reduce the amount we have to deal with. In particular, we are asking authors to explain, at the time of submission, why this journal is appropriate for their papers. We are also being stricter about drawing a line between JDM as a field, on the one hand, and certain other fields that are the source of many submissions (even high-quality ones), particularly social, personality and pure cognitive psychology, marketing, and behavioral and theoretical economics. We continue to accept papers in behavioral economics, but only if they relate to some general issue in the tradition of JDM; a demonstration that some intervention is helpful, without any such general explanations, is better in other journals.

We have of course been slowed down by the COVID-19 pandemic. Many reviewers, associate editors, and even editors got through periods where they must care for small children and cannot do as much as they might otherwise do.

I am also trying to get help with production. At the very least, other people should know how it is done, so I am asking a few people to help with the production of articles. In the course of doing that, they may also provide advice about how to make the task easier. One thing I have done already is to change to a single-column format, which should greatly simplify the most difficult part of production, figures and tables. It will require more paper use by those who print, but I think that fewer and fewer people do this. Volunteers are welcome, as well as comments on the format (bearing in mind that not everything is possible).

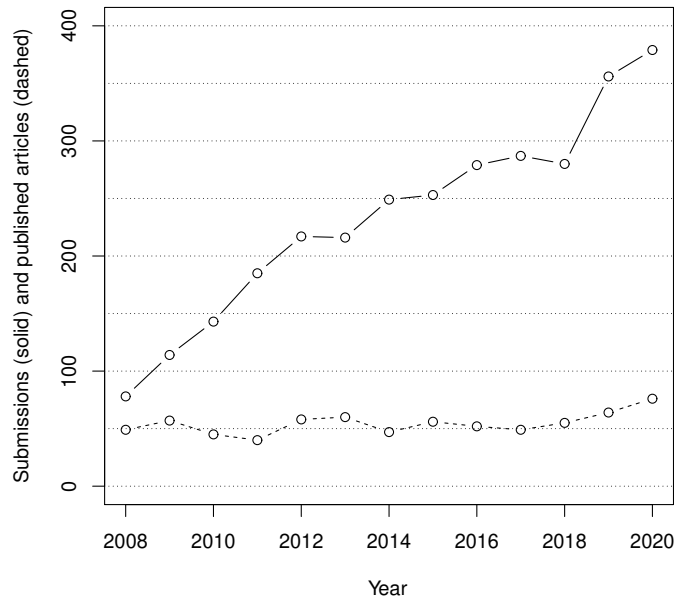

Data about the journal

The following plot shows the continuing trends: more submissions but also a clearer increase in the number of published articles. 69% of the rejections took 1 or 2 days.



For what it is worth, articles from *Judgment and Decision Making* continue to be cited at about the same rate as those from the most similar journal, *Journal of Behavioral Decision Making*, according to Google Scholar. The respective h5 indices, as of December 31, 2020, are 32 and 29, respectively. The impact factor (Web of Science) of *Judgment and Decision Making* for 2019 was 2.163, which was higher than *Journal of Behavioral Decision Making* (1.715) and somewhat lower than *Organizational Behavior and Human Decision Processes* (2.304), roughly the same as 2018.
