### **OBITUARY**

## ROBERTA E. McKOWN 1932-1984

Roberta E. (Bobby) McKown, Professor of Political Science and Chairman of the department from 1975 to 1982, died in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, of cancer, on February 15, 1984.

Dr. McKown was born in Endicott, New York, and moved to Oregon in her youth. She was educated at the University of Oregon, where she received a B.A. in economics and an M.A. and Ph.D. (1968) in political science.

Appointed as an assistant professor of political science at the University of Alberta in 1968, she was promoted to associate professor in 1972 and to professor in 1977. She was asked very early on to show her talent in administration by serving an 18-month term as associate chairman and graduate chairman from 1970 on, and she spent several years as chairman of the research committee. Soon after her selection as acting chairman in 1975, she was made chairman, serving two terms separated by a study leave. She served as chairman of the Academic Planning Committee of the Faculty of Arts and as a member of the University Graduate Scholarship Committee.

While Dr. McKown devoted the major part of her professional life to administration, her untiring energy enabled her to achieve a high level of scholarship. She was the author of eight chapters in books and of articles in *Comparative Political Studies, Comparative Politics* and a number of other recognized journals. Her scholarly reputation soon spread, and during the span of fourteen years she gave twenty conference papers, all but six outside Canada. Those presented outside North America took her to Addis Ababa, Louvain-la-Neuve, Edinburgh, Melbourne, New Delhi, Moscow, Mexico City and Sydney.

Her contributions were primarily in the area of comparative political development. Her theoretical acumen made her a first-rate graduate supervisor. Her first love regarding empirical research was Africa, and she was well established among internationally known students of African Politics.

Dr. McKown is survived by her husband, Thomas W. Mapp, by a son, Bruce N. Koplin, and by two daughters, Terry E. Koplin and Mara Everett. A memorial service was held at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 29, at the Unitarian Church of Edmonton, 12530-110 Avenue.
