It features a "gallery of interpretations" describing in detail the production concepts behind, and the performance effect of, such interpretations as Tyrone Guthrie's Oedipus Rex and Troilus and Cressida, Peter Brook's King Lear, Max Reinhardt's A Midsummer Night's Dream, Laurence Olivier's Hamlet, and others. 
