

"The above illustration shows an Electric Suction Apparatus which can rightly claim to be more efficient than the apparatus generally in use. The suction is continuous and so powerful that clots of blood and the most tenacious mucus are quickly removed. The apparatus is quiet and can easily be moved about the operation theatre and from one theatre to another. It is possible to use it for intra-tracheal

insufficient at the same time as suction since the pump delivers sixty litres of air per minute. The valves in the cylinder head are strong and specially designed for silence in operation and the sump of the machine carries enough oil for six months' continuous use; this ensures efficiency with the minimum of attention. 
type and can therefore be replaced with the minimum of expense. Blood and other fluids are removed from the operating field by the suction plant and find their way into the big bottle. The second bottle is a safety trap in the unlikely event of the first bottle becoming full at a moment when it is inconvenient to change it.


