#### **WILL S. MONROE A Bibliography of Education**

"In the literature of education, Will S. Monroe's *Bibliography of Education* (1897) has an important place. Its reissuance is prompted not only by its scarcity (it is generally unobtainable in the antiquarian trade), but also by the recognition that it has never really been superseded and that as in the case of most bibliographical works it has a continuing relevancy and importance. In the field of educational bibliography, which has been since Monroe's time unfortunately neglected, Monroe's work has a particular significance and might be characterized as one of the few truly significant registers of bibliographical materials available; in any event, with all of its limitations and its age, there is in English no counterpart for our time, or any works which bring together the information contained in Monroe."
