In a rich survey encompassing music, art, literature, and architecture, Professor Davies studies the revolution in religious thought and worship in England during the Victorian period. One main trend, the return to conservatism, is revealed in the renaissance of Roman Catholic worship, the Oxford movement, and the search for traditional architecture and liturgy. This is the fourth in a five-volume series. Volume 3, *From Watts and Wesley to Maurice, 1690-1850*, was published in 1961; the other volumes are yet to be published.

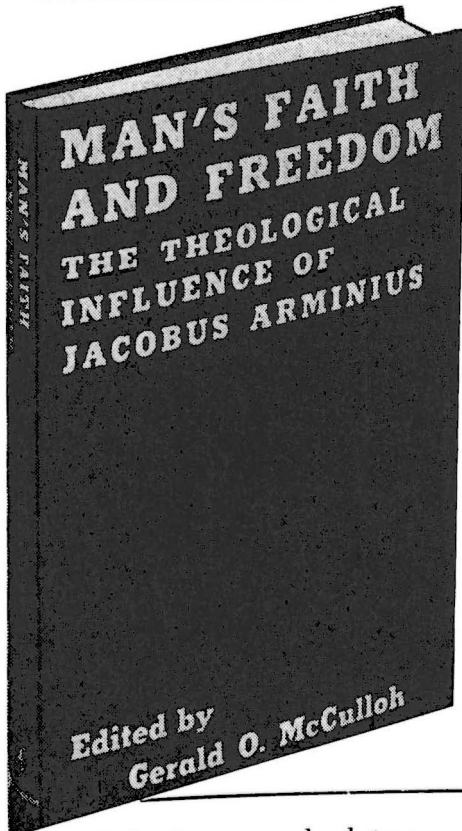

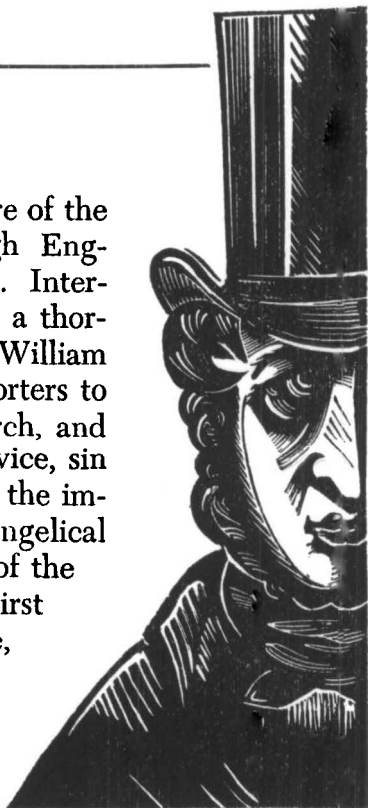
