Because space is limited, articles which have been or soon will be published elsewhere are not accepted. Unsolicited book reviews are not accepted.

The entire text, including footnotes and headings, of manuscripts submitted for publication must be prepared in double-spaced typescript with generous margins to allow for copyediting. Manuscripts should be submitted in two copies. Footnotes must be numbered consecutively and should be placed in a separate section at the end of the text. It would be very helpful if authors would supply a computer disk with the article, in ASCII text format (MS-DOS) or Word Perfect, on either 3½" or 5¼" double-sided diskettes.

Further guidelines for the preparation of manuscripts for publication in *Central European History* will be sent upon acceptance of materials by the editor. All materials will be edited to conform with *The Chicago Manual of Style* in matters regarding punctuation, capitalization, and format.
