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The BULLETIN invites submission of Articles and Communications. Articles should be expository or survey papers of broad interest that are accessible to a wide audience of logicians. They may deal with any areas of logic including mathematical or philosophical logic, logic in computer science or linguistics, the history or philosophy of logic, and applications of logic to other fields. Communications should be announcements of important new results and ideas in any aspect of logic; they may be short papers in their final form or preliminary announcements (extended abstracts, position papers) of longer, full papers that will be published elsewhere. In any case, they should include, in addition to a description of the new results or ideas, enough history, background, and explanation to make the significance of the work apparent to a wide audience. Communications will be quickly refereed and published within six months of the submission of final versions.
