Association For Behaviour Modification With Children First Annual Study Conference at Leamington Spa - May 1978

The first annual study conference of the A.B.M.C. is to be held at the Clarendon Hotel, Leamington Spa, Warwickshire, on Friday, the 12th, and Saturday, the 13th May 1978. The theme of the conference will be "The Practice of Behaviour Modification Techniques with Children". The aim of the conference is to encourage those interested in using behavioural techniques with children to get together in an informal and relaxed atmosphere to share their experiences, successes and failures. Papers will, therefore, be given by members of the A.B.M.C. who themselves have had experience of setting up and running behavioural programmes in a variety of settings with children. There will also be a film of the Achievement Place programme with adolescent delinquents in the U.S.A. and filmed material from other programmes. A business meeting formally setting up the A.B.M.C. will also be arranged during the conference.

Participation in the conference is particularly welcome from all practitioners of behavioural techniques with children whatever their discipline, and those who are interested but not necessarily experienced in using such techniques in ordinary and special schools, community homes, residential schools and hospitals. The emphasis throughout the study conference will be on practical aspects of using behavioural techniques.

There are only fifty five places available, so please register early to avoid disappointment.
