THE EDINBURGH MATHEMATICAL SOCIETY is instituted for the promotion and extension of Mathematical Science—Pure and Applied.

It consists of Ordinary and Honorary Members.

Candidates for admission as Ordinary Members are nominated at one ordinary meeting of the Society, and balloted for at the next, a majority of at least two-thirds of the members present being necessary for election.

The Annual Subscription for ordinary membership is fifteen shillings, but any member may compound for his annual subscriptions by a payment of fourteen guineas payable under covenant in seven annual instalments of two guineas each.

The Committee of the Society may nominate as Honorary Members persons eminently distinguished in the Mathematical Sciences. The mode of election is, otherwise, the same as for Ordinary Members.

Each Member whose Subscription is not in arrears receives the *Proceedings* and the *Edinburgh Mathematical Notes* as published. Authors of papers who are Members of the Society are entitled to receive 25 reprints of their papers free of charge.

Members can obtain back numbers of the publications—as far as these are in print—at reduced prices on application to the Hon. Secretary. Other intending purchasers of the *Proceedings* should apply to the Publishers, G. Bell & Sons, Ltd., Portugal Street, London, W.C.2. All intending purchasers of the *Edinburgh Mathematical Notes* should apply to the Hon. Secretary. Certain volumes of the *Proceedings* are out of print or very scarce, and the Hon. Secretary will therefore be glad to hear from members willing to give or sell their collections to the Society. Such gifts will be earmarked if desired for transmission to war-damaged libraries needing them.
