MEETINGS

SAFETY OF NAVIGATION UNDER SAIL. A joint meeting with the Royal Ocean Racing Club, to be held at 1430 on Tuesday, 15 February 1977 at the Royal Aeronautical Society, 4 Hamilton Place, London W.1. The problems to be discussed include the navigational requirements of ocean racing, with particular reference to safety; collision avoidance and the implications for sailing craft of the new collision regulations; sailing in the vicinity of traffic separation areas; singlehanded sailing; radar reflectors and the use of transponders; the value of weather forecasting; navigation lights, and radio aids for small craft.
