Wednesday 29 — Friday 31 August 1990, London

ASTOVL is an exciting and challenging subject. The International Powered Lift Conference provides an outstanding opportunity for experts from the UK, USA and USSR to present and discuss the technology needed to develop and exploit the concept further. Papers at the conference will describe:
