employed in their respective departments, indicating the total number of members in such department, the number of tenured women, the number of tenure-track women, and the number of consecutive years that such department has been in this third category.

Silva moved passage of this resolution.

Krislov proposed that the Whereas clause be amended to read: "WHEREAS: It has been the policy of the American Political Science Association since 1969 to promote advancement of women for study, awarding financial support, academic employment and consideration for promotion." Amendment of the Whereas clause carried by a voice vote. Krislov then proposed raising the number of department members from 10 or more to 15 or more. In a show of hands vote, the amendment to increase the number of members from 10 to 15 passed nine to eight.

The resolution, as amended, passed by a show of hands vote, 17 to 4.

Relationship of Political Scientists in Government to Political Scientsts

in Universities

Holden stated that he would like to have the Committee on Human Resources consider whether there is a practical way of developing systematic relationships to the political scientists who are employed in government and of helping them to relate to each other, and to their colleagues, from a political science base; and whether any professional consensus exists or is likely to emerge on the utility of developing at least some graduate-level, doctoral competences in a more operational political science, leading to careers other than those in which the prime emphasis is teaching and academic research.

APSA Representation on SSRC Committee on Biological Bases

of Social Behavior

Holden moved that the Executive Director be instructed to communicate vigorously with the Social Science Research Council to support membership in the Committee on Biological Bases of Social Behavior of a political scientist. Motion defeated by a voice vote.

APSA Relationships with IPSA and Political Science in Other Countries

The Council received a letter from Chadwick Alger concerning international relations. Kirkpatrick stated that the Association is a member of the International Political Science Association and pays \$1,500 per year dues which is the highest paid by any Association participating. Further, APSA has distributed information on IPSA meetings, has carried advertisements about membership in IPSA, the *International Political Science Abstracts*, and their meetings; has a section in *PS* on international political science and has written to all national associations; that APSA has foreign participation in the Congressional Fellowship Program; that APSA has been of assistance to foreign political scientists visiting the United States; and that travel grants have been provided to our Annual Meetings for foreign students and grants for travel for individuals to international meetings.
