The IXth In-Service Training and Continuing Self-Assessment Examination in Neurology

The in-service training and selfassessment examination sponsored by the American Academy of Neurology will be given throughout the United States and Canada on Saturday, May 15th, 1982. The examination will consist of approximately 480 multiple choice questions, utilizing the format of the National Board of the Medical Examiners, and will cover the following areas: (1) Clinical Neurology, (2) Pediatric Neurology, (3) Neuroanatomy, (4) Neuropathology, (5) Neuropharmacology/Neurochemistry, (6) Neurophysiology (including EEG and EMG) and (7) Neuroradiology. The examination will be given at centres with neurology training programs. The examination is thorough and clinically relevant.

Resident, faculty and practitioners in related fields are invited to take the examination on this date at a designated neurological training centre. Results of the examination will be provided only to the individual taking the examination. Anonymity will be preserved. An additional feature following this examination will be the provision of the "key word" report to each individual. The report lists the specific content assessed by each item the individual answered incorrectly.

Cost of the examination will be \$55.00 for residents and \$110.00 for others. A \$5.00 advance registration discount will apply on all applications received on or before March 5th, 1982. Deadline for receipt of applications is March 25th, 1982.

A cancellation fee of \$10.00 will be charged each written cancellation received on or before May 12th, 1982. No other cancellation requests will be honoured.

The newly established Killam awards of the Canada Council are intended to support scholars of exceptional ability engaged in research projects of broad significance and widespread interest. The Killam awards have been made possible through the bequest of Mrs. Dorothy J. Killam and through a gift made by Mrs. Killam before her death. Two categories of award are offered under the Killam Program, (1) the Izaak Walton Killam award and (2) Research Fellowships.

The Izaak Walton Killam memorial prize is valued at \$50,000 and only Canadian citizens are eligible. Scholars cannot apply but must be nominated by three experts in their respective fields.

The Research Fellowships are offered on a competitive basis to support research in medicine, humanities, engineering etc. Research Fellowships provide partial or full salary placement to a maximum of \$50,000 based on actual salary at the time of application.
