There are guides and guides. This is one of the best sixpennyworth that we have seen. It combines a useful account of the site with a brief description of those parts which are still to be seen and the objects found. The description of Corstopitum as a 'station' is perhaps misleading to some, but it was an important road station during the greater part of the Roman occupation, and it was perhaps only the death of the emperor Severus at York in A.D. 211 that prevented it from becoming a legionary fortress. An adequate description of the finds could hardly be contained in the four and a half pages allocated to this section. Mr Birley more than hints that Corstopitum may have had some sub-Roman existence after the close of the 4th century, and the fact that the names of Corstopitum and Luguvallium (Carlisle) alone of all the Roman sites in Northumberland and Cumberland are still partly incorporated in the modern names of the sites is suggestive. Corchester was the name attached to the site of Corstopitum, and the Anglian chester of the one gives place to the Celtic caer of the other. W.P.H.
