Editorial Policy

The **American Journal of Germanic Linguistics and Literatures** invites contributions in the form of original articles on all aspects of the Germanic languages, including English and Scandinavian, from the earliest phases to the present, as well as on the linguistic facets of works of literature in those languages written prior to the eighteenth century. Topics may include, but are not limited to, the historical development of those languages, their structure, their Indo-European and pre-Indo-European antecedents, word formation, lexicology, syntax, semantics, pragmatics, dialectology, language use and folklore. Contributions may utilize any methodology or approach, including computer analysis.

The journal appears twice a year, in January and July. Each issue contains four to six articles, reviews, notices of interest to readers and, from time to time, review articles. Reviews and notices may include the most recent research in Germanic languages and literatures. Contributions may be in English or German.

Information on Submissions

Those wishing to submit articles to the journal, as well as reviewers, should read the "Instructions for Authors" carefully. This information appears in the first issue of every odd-numbered volume; a copy may also be obtained from the Editor. Articles submitted which the Editor deems to fall within the scope of the journal will be reviewed anonymously by at least two readers. Authors should state in the letter accompanying the typescript that the article is not under review by any other journal. While the time needed to evaluate an article may vary because of the need to consult several readers, it is the policy of the journal to try to give the author a decision as to the acceptance of his or her article within 90 days. Unsolicited reviews cannot be accepted. Anyone wishing to review a book should contact the Review Editor. The copyright on all articles, reviews and other items is held by the College of Languages, Linguistics and Literature of the University of Hawaii on behalf of the Society for Germanic Philology. All questions not covered by the above, as well as requests for further information, should be directed to the Editor.

Subscription Information

Individuals may receive the journal by becoming members of the Society for Germanic Philology. Dues per calendar year are \$25.00 for regular members, \$15.00 for student and retired members. Libraries and other institutions may subscribe to the journal without membership in the Society; institutional subscriptions, which may be placed through agents, are \$40.00 per volume. Applications for membership in the Society and orders for subscriptions to the journal should be directed to the Associate Editor.
