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The American Journal of Germanic Linguistics and Literatures invites contributions in the form of original articles on all aspects of the Germanic languages, including English and Scandinavian, from the earliest phases to the present, as well as on the linguistic facets of works of literature in those languages written prior to the eighteenth century. Topics may include, but are not limited to, the historical development of those languages, their structure, their Indo-European and pre-Indo-European anteccedents, word formation, lexicology, syntax, semantics, pragmatics, dialectology, language use and folklore. Contributions may utilize any methodology or approach, including computer analysis.

The journal appears twice a year, in January and July. Each issue contains four to six articles, reviews, notices of interest to readers and, from time to time, review articles. Reviews and notices may include the most recent research in Germanic languages and literatures. Contributions may be in English or German.

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
