Because space is limited, articles which have been or soon will be published elsewhere are not accepted, nor are translations of such articles. Unsolicited book reviews are not accepted. The entire text, including footnotes, of manuscripts submitted for publication must be prepared in double-spaced typescript, with generous margins to allow for copy-editing. Footnotes should be numbered consecutively, and should be placed in a separate section at the end of the text. It has become essential to require *two copies* of manuscripts, to expedite editorial evaluation and to guard against loss in the mails.
