It is fitting that the tenth anniversary of this journal should coincide with the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the birth of Jeremy Bentham. Events to mark *Bentham 250* are mentioned below. The journal itself will play its part with the publication of an article on Bentham by its founding editor, Professor Fred Rosen. This article will appear in the next number, with responses by several leading scholars.

The completion of ten years of *Utilitas* will be marked in 10.3 with the publication of a symposium on the ethics of Sir David Ross, including an article by Professor David Wiggins.

In the mean time, I hope readers will enjoy and learn from the wideranging collection of papers in this special edition of *Utilitas* on J. S. Mill. I remember reading once that the average number of readers of any philosophical article is six. *Utilitas* articles, I believe, score well above the average, to judge by the number of comments on papers I am asked to forward to authors. In this connection, I have decided to include available E-mail addresses of authors, to encourage direct communication between author and critic.

For those interested in statistics: Of submissions to the journal in 1997, 34% were from North America, 29% from the UK, 13% from the rest of Europe, 11% from Australasia, and 13% from elsewhere.

Readers of *Utilitas* will have been saddened to hear of the death of Richard Brandt at the end of last year, at the age of 89. As well as being one of the most important moral philosophers of the century, Brandt was highly supportive of this journal. A tribute to him by Brad Hooker will appear in the next number.
