# THE SOCIETY'S BUSINESS

REPORT OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON TUESDAY, 30TH APRIL, 1963, AT 5.30 P.M.

The Marquess of Willingdon, President, in the Chair.

- 1. The Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting were read, confirmed and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. Auditor's Report.—The Chairman proposed and it was carried unanimously that the Report of the Auditors and the Accounts for the year ending 31st December, 1962, be approved and adopted.
- 3. Annual Report.—The Chairman proposed and it was carried unanimously that the Report of the Council for the year ending 31st December, 1962, be approved and adopted.
- 4. Election of Officers.—It was proposed by Mr. John Hillaby, seconded by Mr. E. P. Field and carried unanimously that the Marquess of Willingdon be re-elected President of the Society and Mr. I. D. Malcolmson re-elected Honorary Treasurer.
- 5. New Vice-Presidents.—The following were unanimously elected Vice-Presidents:—

6. New Members of Council.—It was proposed from the Chair and carried unanimously that the following elections to the Council be confirmed:—

7. Chairman's Address.—The Chairman, in a brief address, thanked the Meeting, on behalf of Mr. Malcolmson and himself, for their re-election.

The Chairman then said that it was with great regret that he had to announce Colonel Boyle's decision to retire from the Secretaryship of the Society at the end of 1963. He then thanked Colonel Boyle on behalf of the Council and members of the Society for the work he had done and said that there would always be a seat on the Council for him.

The Chairman announced that Mr. R. S. R. Fitter would succeed Colonel Boyle as Secretary, and Mrs. Fitter would become Editor of *Oryx*. Mr. John Hillaby would continue as the Society's Public Relations Officer.

The Chairman told the Meeting that Dr. T. C. S. Morrison-Scott, Director of the Natural History Museum, had agreed to become Vice-Chairman of the Council.

8. Lecture.—Immediately after the Annual General Meeting, Mr. John Hillaby gave an illustrated talk entitled "A Foot Safari in East Africa".
