

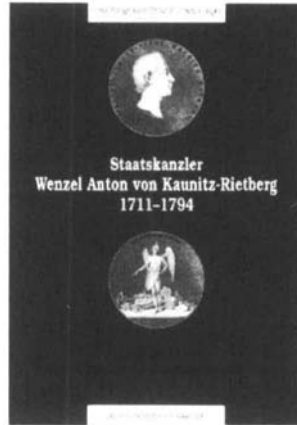

This major collection gathers together 29 essays by leading scholars from nine countries on the life and career of the great State Chancellor of the Habsburg Monarchy from 1753 to 1792, Prince Wenzel Anton Kaunitz-Rietberg. Together the contributions bring much new information about this neglected but pivotal statesman to light, which leads not only to a fundamental reevaluation of Kaunitz himself, but of the whole era of enlightened absolutism in the Habsburg Monarchy. The volume is divided into four parts: State Chancellor and Foreign Policy, Ecclesiastical and Administrative Reforms, Enlightenment and Patronage, and Familial Policies.
