THE MISSING CASEBOOK OF DR THOMAS

The casebook of Dr R. S. Thomas, a practitioner in Exmouth, Devon, dates from the early 1900s. It was lent to Dr Irvine Loudon in 1980 when he was a member of the Wellcome Unit in Oxford. No trace of it can now be found, and no record of its being lent elsewhere or returned to its owner. It is needed by the historian of the practice in question.

The casebook is about 14 inches wide and 8 inches tall, hardbound, perhaps partly in leather. Some pages are printed for casenotes, with columns and entries for patients' details. There are fold-out temperature charts.
