

These Archaeological Reports are published by the Hellenic Society and the British School at Athens for their subscribers. They are also offered for sale to the public, and are obtainable from the Secretary, The Hellenic Society, 31-34 Gordon Square, London, WC1H OPP. They have in the past been published in the winter, but the production schedule is being changed so that from 1978 they will appear in July, partly to achieve greater immediacy of reporting, partly to coincide more conveniently with the timetables of the contributors and of the British School. Each volume will thus cover a single calendar year, rather than two half-years as in the past: this issue, for 1977, is being published in November according to an interim schedule, and since the customary report on Archaeology in Greece would have been very slender, coming so soon after the previous *Reports*, Dr Catling has instead compiled two special reports on recent work by the British School at Knossos and Sparta. The 1978 *Reports* will again contain his account of recent work by archaeologists of all nationalities in Greece.

The *Reports* normally also contain accounts of work in other parts of the Greek world, including South Italy and Sicily (this year), Central and Northern Italy and Etruria, the Greek Far East (next year), Western Asia Minor (1979), the Black Sea, and other parts of the Mediterranean basin. In addition there are occasional special reports on work by British archaeologists on 'Greek' sites, and regular bulletins illustrating new acquisitions by museums in Great Britain: this year however the museum section is devoted to the Cyprus museums, held over from the last issue. The reports from Manchester, Bolton and Liverpool will, it is hoped, appear in 1978.
