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SHEA Long-Term-Care Committee

The SHEA Long-Term-Care Committee, chaired by Dr. Lindsay Nicolle, welcomed three new members to the committee: Dr. Kurt Stevenson from Idaho, Dr. Mark Loeb from Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, and Dr. Rodolfo Quiros from Argentina.

The committee continues to be active in the development of guidelines for long-term-care facilities (LTCFs). Within the past year, they published an updated

position paper on antimicrobial use in LTCFs (Infect Control Hosp Epidemiol 2000;21:537-545) and a new guideline dealing with urinary tract infections in LTCFs (Infect Control Hosp Epidemiol 2001;22:167-175), and contributed in large part to development of the minimum consensus criteria for initiation of antibiotics in LTCFs under the leadership of Dr. Mark Loeb (Infect Control Hosp Epidemiol 2001; 22:120-124). Under the leadership of Dr.

Lauri Thrupp, the committee currently is finalizing a guideline dealing with tuberculosis in LTCFs, and, under the leadership of Dr. Andy Simor, the committee will initiate a guideline dealing with *Clostridium difficile* in LTCFs. The committee chair, co-chair, and members would be delighted to hear from members of the organization with respect to any comments about the published guidelines, as well as suggestions for further needs.
