
THE "SCLEROTIC" MASTOID PROCESS.

DEAR SIRS,—The "Sclerotic" type of mastoid process to which Dr MacGibbon referred in the August number is very rare and is seen in about 1 per cent. of bones.

The acellular type, of which I send an illustration, is fairly common, and I have said that it is responsible for middle-ear suppuration becoming chronic.



In May 1908, I first described this type of bone, and I see that Professor Mouret and Professor Wittmaack are going to discuss the subject next year at the International Congress in Copenhagen.—Yours faithfully,
