MEMBERSHIP AND SUBSCRIPTION

He is Chairman of its Asian Studies Program and Director of the Uralic and Altaic Language and Area Center. He will be helped in his task by an efficient administrative apparatus and a Faculty the expertise of which covers wide fields of Asian Studies.


