This is an intensive course reviewing all the major groups of insects. The aim of the course is to equip participants with the knowledge and skills to provide 'on-the-spot' identification of the more familiar species associated with important crops.

It is intended for entomologists working in the tropics in the fields of agriculture, forestry or environmental protection. Applicants should have some previous experience of insect identification and should ideally be involved in identifying insects in their daily work or providing an identification service to others. They are likely to be working in government ministries, national or international research institutes, universities and museums or reference collections.

Fees: A course fee of £1,800 is payable in advance by successful applicants. This fee <u>does not</u> include the cost of travel to and from London or accommodation.
