Contributions submitted for publication in the Society's *Journal* should be typed in double spacing on A4 or quarto paper, leaving a margin of at least 16 strokes at the left-hand side. Sheets should be numbered consecutively at the top right-hand corner. Notes, numbered consecutively through the article, should be typed on a separate sheet or sheets at the end.

Authors are urged to study the conventions employed in recent issues of the *Journal*, particularly the style of citation of books and periodical articles, and the bibliographical information inserted at the head of reviews. Contributions should be submitted in a form ready for the printer; later corrections, *whether involving over-running or not*, can be accepted only at the Editor's discretion and may incur a charge to the author.
