The African Studies Review (ASR) convenes Pipeline for Emerging African Scholars (PEAS) Workshops, in collaboration with the African Studies Association of Africa (ASAA <http://www.as-aa.org>), to stimulate, solicit, and further develop high quality journal submissions from Africa-based scholars under the close mentorship of senior Africanists from the continent and beyond. In collaboration with the ASAA the ASR will sponsor a PEAS workshop at the University of Ghana, Legon, on October 11, 2017. Scholars who wish to submit a proposal are, ideally, post-doctoral researchers, newly minted PhDs with works-in-progress currently underway, and soon-to-submit PhD students. Emerging scholars will have an opportunity to work closely with senior scholars to re-work a pre-circulated draft article.

The broader goals of PEAS are:

1. To increase submissions from emerging Africa-based scholars to top-rated journals, especially ASR;
2. To improve the quality of submissions from emerging Africa-based scholars;
3. To increase the R&R (revise and resubmission) rate from emerging Africa-based scholars;
4. To improve access to the ASR for emerging Africa-based scholars; and,
5. To increase participation of emerging Africa-based scholars in review process.

Eligibility & Application Criteria:

1. Applications may be submitted in English, French, or Portuguese **BY JULY 31, 2017**;
2. All applicants shall be members of ASAA [<http://www.as-aa.org/index.php/membership>] and shall submit an abstract for the ASAA 2017 annual conference to be held at the University of Ghana, Legon [see <http://www.as-aa.org/index.php/asaa-2017-conference/call-for-papers-posters-and-panels> in English, French, and Portuguese];
3. PhD student applicants shall be in the second year of their program or higher;
4. Early career applicants shall have completed their PhD within the past five years; and,
5. Priority shall be given to applicants from under-resourced institutions; women are particularly encouraged to apply.

Submission Process:

Applicants for a PEAS workshop must prepare the following **BY JULY 31, 2017**:

1. A cover letter that outlines the applicant's broad academic goals and interests, and gives an express commitment to revise and submit the material of the workshop to the ASR for peer-review and possible publication;
 2. A current curriculum vitae listing all educational qualifications, research funding received, pending applications, publications, and employment history;
 3. A polished draft article of between 5000-10,000 words, with complete citations;
 4. One letter of recommendation from an individual familiar with the applicant, addressed to the ASR's Editor-in-Chief, Benjamin N. Lawrance, that includes, but is not limited to (a) confirmation that the recommender has read either the submission or previous work by the applicant; (b) an evaluation of the draft work; (c) confirmation that the recommender considers the work well enough developed to be on the path to submission to a journal; and (d) confirmation of the academic standing and progress of the applicant as represented in the accompanying CV;
 5. Either, evidence of status as a PhD student, including year in program, or, for early career applicants, a letter from their Head of Department indicating their status;
 6. For early career applicants ONLY, a copy of PhD certificate/diploma awarded;
- The entire dossier shall be compiled as a single PDF file and submitted by email to ASAA Conference Secretariat asaaconference@gmail.com with ASR PEAS workshop in the subject line.

Selection Criteria:

Applicants selected for participation will be notified by the ASR's Managing Editor after confirmation of the applicant's ASAA registration, by **SEPTEMBER 1, 2017**.

All successful applicants shall receive the following:

1. Payment of ASAA conference registration fee;
2. Accommodation for three nights (workshop and ASAA meeting); and,
3. Meals for three days and nights (workshop and ASAA meeting).

Applicants are responsible for their own travel and all other costs incurred. However, limited funding for travel within the continent courtesy of the Royal Air Maroc, and accommodation courtesy of the African Studies Association (USA) is available. Priority will be given to applicants from under-resourced institutions. Women are particularly encouraged to apply.

1. Augmenter le nombre de propositions de la part de chercheur-e-s émergent-e-s basé-e-s en Afrique envoyées aux meilleures revues scientifiques, surtout l'ASR;
2. Améliorer la qualité des propositions de la part de chercheur-e-s émergent-e-s basé-e-s en Afrique;
3. Augmenter le taux de R&R (réviser et resoumettre) des chercheur-e-s émergent-e-s basé-e-s en Afrique;
4. Améliorer l'accès à l'ASR pour les chercheur-e-s émergent-e-s basé-e-s en Afrique; et,
5. Accroître la participation des chercheur-e-s émergent-e-s basé-e-s en Afrique au processus d'évaluation scientifique.

Critères de candidature:

1. Les candidatures peuvent être envoyées en anglais, français ou portugais **D'ICI LE 31 JUILLET 2017**;
2. Tou-te-s les candidat-e-s doivent être membres de l'ASAA [<http://www.as-aa.org/index.php/membership>] et présenteront une proposition de communication pour le colloque annuel de l'ASAA 2017 qui se déroulera à l'University of Ghana, Legon [consultez le <http://www.as-aa.org/index.php/asaa-2017-conference/call-for-papers-posters-and-panels> en anglais, français et portugais];

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3. Les étudiant-e-s au doctorat doivent être au moins en deuxième année;
4. Les demandeurs en début de carrière doivent avoir complété leur doctorat dans les cinq dernières années; et,
5. La priorité sera accordée aux demandeurs d'établissements sous-financés; les femmes sont particulièrement encouragées à nous envoyer leur candidature.

Processus d'envoi de candidature:

Les candidat-e-s à un atelier PEAS doivent préparer les documents suivants **D'ICI LE 31 JUILLET 2017** :

1. Une lettre de présentation décrivant les objectifs de recherche et intérêts généraux du/de la candidat-e et qui s'engage expressément à réviser et resoumettre le travail effectué lors de l'atelier à l'ASR pour une évaluation scientifique et une publication éventuelle;
2. Un CV actuel répertoriant tous les diplômes, tous les fonds de recherche reçus, les demandes en attente, les publications et leur parcours professionnel;
3. Un brouillon d'article bien révisé d'entre 5000-10,000 mots, y compris une bibliographie complète;
4. Une lettre de recommandation d'un individu qui connaît le/la candidat-e, adressée au Rédacteur en chef de l'ASR, Benjamin N. Lawrance, qui comprend, entre autres éléments, (a) une confirmation que l'écrivain-e de la lettre a lu soit la proposition en question, soit un travail effectué par le passé par le demandeur; (b) une évaluation de la proposition d'article; (c) une confirmation que l'écrivain-e de la lettre considère le brouillon comme étant assez développé pour une proposition éventuelle à une revue scientifique; et (d) une confirmation du statut d'étudiant-e et du progrès du/de la candidat-e tel que décrits dans le CV;
5. Soit, une preuve du statut d'étudiant-e au doctorat, y compris l'année en cours, ou, pour les candidat-e-s en début de carrière, une lettre de leur Chef de département indiquant leur statut;
6. Pour les demandeurs en début de carrière SEULEMENT, une copie de leur certificat/ diplôme de doctorat;

Le dossier au complet doit être combiné sous forme d'un seul fichier PDF et envoyé par courrier électronique au Secrétariat du colloque de l'ASAA à asaaconference@gmail.com avec comme objet Atelier ASR PEAS.

Critères de sélection :

Les candidat-e-s choisi-e-s pour participer seront informé-e-s par le Rédacteur gérant de l'ASR après confirmation de l'inscription du demandeur à l'ASAA, d'ici le **1 SEPTEMBRE 2017**.

Tou-te-s les candidat-e-s retenu-e-s recevront le soutien suivant:

1. Paiement des frais d'inscription au colloque de l'ASAA;
2. L'hébergement pour trois nuits (l'atelier et la rencontre de l'ASAA);
3. Les repas pour trois jours et nuits (l'atelier et la rencontre de l'ASAA).

Tou-te-s les candidat-e-s doivent couvrir leurs frais de déplacement et toutes autres dépenses. Cependant, grâce à Royal Air Maroc, un financement limité sera disponible pour les déplacements au sein du continent, ainsi qu'un hébergement fourni par l'Association des études africaines (É-U). 1. Aumentar a participação de estudiosos emergentes baseados na África em publicações importantes, especialmente na ASR (African Studies Review);
2. Para aumentar a qualidade das apresentações dos estudiosos emergentes baseados na África;
3. Para aumentar o índice de R&R (revisão e reapresentação) dos estudiosos emergentes baseados na África;
4. Para melhorar o acesso à ASR para os estudiosos emergentes baseados na África; e,
5. Para aumentar a participação de estudiosos emergentes baseados na África no processo de análise.

Crítérios de inscrição e elegibilidade:

1. As inscrições deverão ser enviadas em inglês, francês ou português;
2. Todos candidatos deverão ser membros da Associação Africana de Estudos Africanos - AAEA [<http://www.as-aa.org/index.php/membership>] e deverão enviar um resumo para a Conferência anual da AAEA 2017 que acontecerá na Universidade de Gana, Legon [Confira <http://www.as-aa.org/index.php/asaa-2017-conference/call-for-papers-posters-and-panels> em inglês, francês e português];

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3. Candidatos doutorandos deverão estar pelo menos no segundo ano de seus programas ou mais;
4. Candidatos em começo de carreira deverão ter completado seus doutorados há não mais que cinco anos atrás; e,
5. A prioridade será dada a participantes vindos de instituições carentes de recursos; mulheres são particularmente encorajadas a se inscreverem.

Processo de submissão:

Candidatos para a oficina PEAS devem preparar o seguinte:

1. Uma carta de apresentação que resuma os interesses e objetivos acadêmicos do candidato dando um compromisso expresso para revisar e submeter o material da oficina para a ASR para análise pelos colegas ou possível publicação;
 2. Um Curriculum Vitae atual listando todas qualificações educacionais, fundos de pesquisa recebidos, solicitações pendentes, publicações e histórico profissional;
 3. Um projeto de artigo caprichado de aproximadamente 5000-10.000 palavras, com citações completas;
 4. Uma carta de recomendação de um indivíduo conhecido do candidato endereçada ao Editor Chefe da ASR, Benjamin N. Lawrance, que inclua mas não se limite a:
(a) confirmação que a pessoa que está recomendando tenha lido o artigo sendo enviado ou trabalhos prévios do candidato; (b) uma avaliação do projeto do trabalho; (c) confirmação que a pessoa que está recomendando considera o trabalho bem desenvolvido o suficiente para estar a caminho de ser publicado; e (d) confirmação do status acadêmico e progresso do candidato apresentado no CV em anexo;
 5. Prova de status de doutorando, incluindo ano do programa, ou para candidatos iniciantes de carreira, uma carta de seu Chefe de Departamento indicando seu status;
 6. Para candidatos iniciantes de carreira SOMENTE, uma cópia do Certificado/Diploma de doutorado (PhD) recebido;
- Todo o dossiê deverá ser compilado num único arquivo PDF e enviado por correio eletrônico para ASAA Conference Secretariat asaaconference@gmail.com com "ASR PEAS workshop" na linha de Assunto.

CrITÉrios de Seleção:
