

INNOVATION IN LIBRARIANSHIP AWARD

Cambridge University Press is now seeking nominations for our annual award, which is intended to focus on innovative developments from early career librarians. The recipient will be awarded a travel stipend to a library conference of their choosing in North America. The inaugural award winner chose to attend the Charleston Conference.

The selection process will be managed through a jury of librarians, who are best positioned to designate a winner.

Cambridge University Press invites you to nominate a colleague working in public, school, college, community college or university libraries. **Nominations can be made now until 5/15/19.**

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Each nominee must be a librarian with a master's degree from a program accredited by the American Library Association in library and information studies or a master's degree with a specialty in school library media from an educational unit accredited by the National Council for the Accreditation of Teacher Education. Nominees must be currently working in the United States in a public library, a library at an accredited two or four-year college or university or at an accredited K-12 school.

TO NOMINATE

Nominations are sought and welcome from the entire profession as well as from trustees, administrators, officials, colleagues, and citizens. Nominating letters should name the candidate and describe in 500 words or less why the nominee is deserving of recognition. Supporting letters and accompanying material will be considered, but the nominating letter itself will be of prime importance.
