Captioned by the moment "Fall not a tear, I say; one of them rates all that is won and lost: Give me a kiss: Even this repays me" (3.11.76-78), this engraving by artist Frank Dicksee illustrates the moment in the play when the pair has just lost a battle at sea with Caesar -- because of the defection of Cleopatra's ships. The illustrator stresses the military consequences of Antony's liaison by having both Cleopatra and a slave buckle Antony back into his armor.
