Boy's songs in plays like Shakespeare's are thought to have been set pieces, and the Boy's "Come, thou monarch of the vine" (2.7.134-139) was likely a generic drinking song. This illustration by Samuel Palmer plays up the mythological references of the song, glossing over the events in the play, where the most powerful men in Rome discuss politics over a round of heavy drinking.
