Edwin Forrest (1806-1872) as Coriolanus. Forrest became famous early in his acting career for his blackface performances, but he is most well known for his role in the deadly Astor Place Riot, which happened as a result of his feud with British actor William Charles Macready. Resentment between the American working-class and British exacerbated the rivalry between these actors, who were competing to be recognized as the superior Shakespearean actor.
