Rowland Buckstone was born into a family of actors in 1860, and first appeared on the stage in 1877 in Edinburgh in Oliver Goldsmith's *She Stoops to Conquer*. He first appeared on the American stage in 1884, and eventually joined E.H. Sothern's company, where he remained for at least 20 years before leaving to produce his own plays.
