



This user guide provides students, instructors and librarians with step-by-step information on using the site.


Setting up Your Account


If you don't have a Cambridge Core account, you can set up an account by selecting the Register button on the top right of the Higher Education homepage. You





Key Functionality


To perform a search, enter your terms in the search box, and select the icon  to view your results.




To see a selection of our latest textbooks and a list of subjects that we publish, scroll down the homepage.



Alternatively, if you want to browse a particular subject area, you can select the Subjects link on top of the page.



On the subject page you can see any available sub-subjects as well as view relevant titles.



You can refine your search by selecting the parameters located on the left side of the search results page. By default, the results are sorted by relevance to the terms you used in your search, but you can sort your search results by author's name, and date of publication, using the drop down menu on the top right of the page. This page also lets you see the content that you can access. If your librarian has enabled the Recommend to Librarian feature, then you can recommend a title to them in this way.






Downloading books in applications







Supplementary Materials

Resources refers to supplementary materials that are available to use with textbooks. Not every book has resources. To view resources available for a title you can select

the Resources tab on the title's main page. If the Resources tab is not visible then no resources are available for that title. Click on View Resources to see available resources.



Resources are divided into two types. General Resources and Instructor Resources. General Resources are free to download without restrictions. Instructor Resources require the user to be validated as an instructor.



To access General Resources click on the links underneath General Resources. You will see the list of resources and a download icon to the far right of the resource. Select the download icon to save that particular resource.



When accessing Instructor Resources you must request access via the 'Unlock instructor resources' button. In order to access this button you must be logged into a Higher Education from Cambridge University Press account and have declared yourself an Instructor when you registered for your user account. You will receive confirmation for this request via your registered email address.
