CALL FOR SPECIAL ISSUE PROPOSALS

(For 2024 special issue)

Due January 10, 2023

The Editorial Board of CJLS/RCDS is seeking proposals for the 2024 special edition of the Journal (Volume 39, Issue 2 or Issue 3) for publication in 2024. The annual thematic special issue, curated by guest editors, will be selected by the Editorial Board during the winter 2023. Each issue explores a theme across a range of genres by contributions from a potentially diverse group of scholars. CJLS/RCDS is an interdisciplinary, peer-reviewed journal that produces cutting edge research dealing with law and its social and cultural context.

As of January 2023, all issues will be fully open access. For authors, this signifies that all articles accepted for publication for forthcoming volumes will be published with a non-exclusive Gold Open Access CC-BY licence (see <u>here</u> for more detail). Most corresponding authors will have their Article Processing Charge (APC) covered by a transformative agreement (check <u>here</u> to see if your institution is covered by an agreement), but any author not covered by a transformative agreement or other funding will have the APC waived. Proposals by potential guest editors must comply with CJLS/RCDS <u>Submission</u> and <u>Special Issue</u> <u>Guidelines</u> aimed at assisting those interested in submitting manuscripts to CJLS/RCDS.
