

Call for papers on

Constitutional Change in Europe

Symposium to be held on 26 May 2023 in Amsterdam

Paper abstracts welcome by 1 February 2023

The editors of the *European Constitutional Law Review* are inviting paper proposals for the 2023 EuConst symposium on constitutional change in Europe.

The theme of constitutional change goes well beyond the issue of constitutional amendment. For the purpose of our colloquium we are interested in change that is significant in terms of changes in the political order and in society.

We particularly invite paper proposals on

- how national constitutions change over time,
- the constitutional limits to change,
- identifying constitutional changes which signify changes that are structural or of a transformative nature,
- how constitutional change relates to changes in the political system or society in respective European states,
- the role of practice and conventions in constitutional change,
- how these changes interact with constitutional change in the European Union or other international organisations, or how constitutional change in the European Union interacts with developments in the member states

Submissions with a comparative constitutional law focus are expressly encouraged.

Proposals in the form of abstracts of no more than 600 words, setting out the core point that is made and how it is made, should be submitted for review by 1 February 2023 to euconst@uva.nl (subject: EuConst symposium). Decisions on accepted papers will be communicated by 15 February 2023. Authors whose proposals are accepted will be expected to submit full papers by 1 May 2023.

The board of editors will be happy to consider accepted papers for publication in EuConst, subject to the usual double-blind peer review process.

Young researchers, within 5 years of completion of their PhD, are especially invited to submit their proposals.
