Cambridge University Press is now inviting applications for the role of co-editor of the journal *Continuity and Change*.

The deadline for applications is 10 January, 2024

Now in its 38th volume, *C&C* aims to define a field of historical sociology concerned with long-term continuities and discontinuities in the structures of past societies. Emphasis is upon studies whose agenda or methodology combines elements from traditional fields such as history, sociology, law, demography, economics or anthropology, or ranges freely between them. There is a strong commitment to comparative studies over a broad range of cultures and time spans.

The Press is seeking applications from scholars whose research expertise align with this mission and who are eager to help take the journal forward into its next phase.

Working with three experienced co-editors, editorial responsibilities will include:

- Shaping the strategic direction of the journal and defining editorial policy
- Overseeing a rigorous, constructive and supportive peer review process
- Making all final decisions on acceptance, rejection and revisions
- Proofing articles accepted for publication in the journal
- Proposing members to join the Editorial Board.

- Your experience publishing and researching in this field
- Previous editorial experience or roles in academic administration
- Your historiographical vision for the journal over the next five years, including:
 - The journal's identity amongst competitor journals
 - Critical themes and subject matter
- Your strategy for developing the journal over the next five years, including:
 - Supporting and attracting diversity
 - Organising and maximising the contribution of the Editorial Board
 - Ensuring academic quality and scholarly impact
 - Engaging with developments in scholarly communication and research practice
