We are seeking a well-connected and experienced social gerontologist to join our editorial team as an Associate Editor.

Key Responsibilities:

- Appraise manuscripts and process desk rejections for those not meeting the journal's criteria.
- Manage the peer review process, including selecting reviewers, providing feedback to authors, and writing decision letters.
- Evaluate revised papers and prepare accepted papers for press.
- Attend editorial team meetings throughout the year plus an annual meeting with the full editorial board.
- Contribute to the development and strategic direction of the journal.

Qualifications and Experience:

- Commitment and enthusiasm for advancing the field of social gerontology demonstrated by a strong record of peer-reviewed papers.
- Strong professional networks, particularly within social gerontology.
- Expertise in quantitative methods in a relevant subject or disciplinary area within the journal's scope.
- Good editorial skills and a high level of proficiency in the English language.
- Previous experience with online manuscript submission systems such as ScholarOne Manuscripts is advantageous but not essential.
