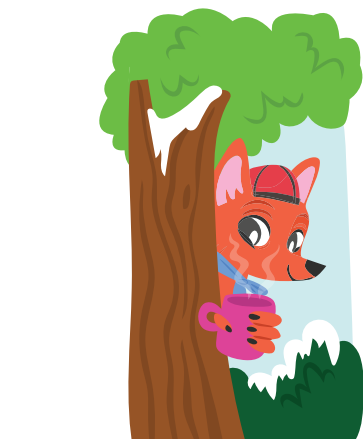

Hi everyone! Welcome to my little corner of the world! I live in the wood, where there are lots of trees and many, many animals. People don't always see all the animals here because we're very good at hiding! Remember, foxes can run really fast, so you might only see our furry tails as we disappear!



- 1 Read what Hunter says about two kinds of animals. Then, put ticks or crosses in the boxes for the three kinds of animals.

"I can't fly like an eagle but I often see those birds in the sky above the trees in the wood. I'm sure they can see me even better! Their wings are huge and their legs are very strong for catching small animals and carrying food. Eagles build their nests in at the top of the tallest trees. Foxes can't climb that high – or fly!"



"Bees are really important insects. Without them, there would be fewer plants – and animals on Earth. Did you know that there are more than 20,000 kinds of bees? The bees we see in our wood have black and yellow stripes on bodies. Bees make their honey from different flowers so not all honey tastes the same. The honey that different bees make often tastes like the flowers they feed on."

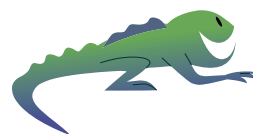
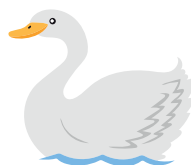
