Think about it Key Reading and Writing Part 4

Complete the information about Key Reading and Writing Part 4 with the correct alternatives.

Key Reading and Writing Part 4 is a (1) reading / writing exercise. Sometimes you will be asked to read three short texts, and sometimes it is one longer text. The number of words you have to read is (2) always / not always the same. There might be (3) lots of / a few words in the text which are not in the KEY vocabulary list, (4) and you will / but you won't need to understand these words to answer the questions correctly. There are seven questions to answer, with three possible answers for each question: (5) (A, B or C) / (1, 2 or 3).

If there is one long text to read, there are two types of multiple-choice questions:

i) Seven (6) long / short questions, each with three possible short answers.

ii) Seven short sentences about the text. You have to decide if each sentence is true, false, or if the information isn't given in the text. With this type of question, the answer will be **(7)** *don't know / not given*.

If there are three short texts to read, they will be labelled with the **(8)** name / number of the person in the text. You will read seven short questions and decide which text gives the answer.

You need to write one or more words for each answer and you will hear the information twice. You should write on the question paper while you are listening. You will then have eight minutes to complete the answer paper at the end of the test.

In Key Speaking Part 1 you need to listen to the examiner and answer their questions. You will have to spell your surname and talk about yourself. There will be another student (or maybe two) in the room too, but in this part of the speaking test you only need to talk to the examiner. There will be two examiners in the room too. One of them will talk to the students and the other one will only listen to you both. You should always try to use good vocabulary and grammar in the speaking test but it is okay to make some mistakes! Key Speaking Part 1 lasts 5–6 minutes.

Think about it Key Speaking Part 2

Read the text. Then match the questions about the Key Speaking test Part 2 with the answers.

In the second part of the speaking test you have to talk to another student. You will have to ask and answer questions but you do not have to give personal information about yourself. The examiner will give you a card with some information on it. The information might be about daily life, hobbies or free times activities. You have to look at the card and answer the other student's questions. For example, your card might have information about a new club or a competition and your partner might ask you questions about times, places or prices on it. You have to find the answers on your card and tell the other student what they are. Later, the examiner will give you a different card and you will ask the other student some questions. This part of the test takes about three or four minutes.
