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General arguments: it's unnatural, it's disgusting, risky, it's only opinion

Questions to stimulate reflection

Do you think a natural product is necessarily better than one that isn't natural? Why?

Can you think of any advantages to 'man-made' fibres or foods over natural ones?

To what extent are feelings of delight and disgust involved in moral judgements?

Can you think of something that is disgusting but not morally wrong?

Is the fact that something is risky a good reason to avoid doing it?

Can you think of three useful inventions that would have been banned had the precautionary principle been applied to them?

What makes the claim 'it is right to tell the truth' true (if it *is* true)?

Jenner injected himself with pus from a cowpox sore in order to test his idea that this would immunise him against cowpox. In doing so he took a risk. Did he act immorally? What if he had used someone else?

If Troy believes abortion is morally acceptable, and Jane believes abortion is morally unacceptable could they both be right?
