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The format and style of the Memoir series is similar to that used in the Journal of Paleontology. Authors should consult a recent issue before preparing their manuscripts, paying particular attention to form of references and synonymies (Stumm & Kesling, 1957, Jour. Paleontology, v. 31, p. 666–672) and to explanations of illustrations and tables. An informative abstract should accompany each manuscript and it should list all new taxonomic names.

Use standard white typewriter paper, $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ inches in size and of at least average weight. All typed material should be double spaced, including footnotes, quoted matter, bibliographies, etc., and the lines should not exceed $5\frac{1}{2}$ or 6 inches in length. Where an addition is to be made, the sheet should be cut and the insert pasted in place; only brief inserts of a word or two should be made on the original. Footnotes should be used only where absolutely necessary and should be typed on separate sheets or at the bottom of the page.

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
