

The title has been changed because of a growing feeling that the major processes into which transformation has generally been divided - stabilisation, liberalisation and privatisation - have in substantial measure been completed in most of the former communist countries, even though this is more true of some than others, and all still have some distance to go to match the long-established market economies in these respects.

Yet despite the dramatic changes that have taken place in the past decade, the post-communist economies still form a clearly identifiable group, presenting distinctive problems. The focus may thus have moved on from basic transformation, but the post-communist economies will continue to be an important area of economic and political analysis. Post-Communist *Economies* will contribute to this research by publishing the key research and policy articles in the field.
